SCHOLARSHIP DESCRIPTION

SCHOLARSHIP TITLE: Lou W. Maertin Memorial Scholarship

DATE INITIALLY ESTABLISHED: January 15, 1994

PURPOSE: This scholarship, named in remembrance of Lou W. Maertin who was an Associate Professor of Mathematics at BCC from 1970 until 1994, is designed to recognize a student who has achieved academic excellence, is physically active and is involved in environmental issues and concerns for making this a more healthy, peaceful, and loving world.

SOURCE OF FUNDING: Lou W. Martin Scholarship Fund

AMOUNT OF AWARD: To be determined each year.

NUMBER OF SCHOLARSHIP(S): Varies

APPLICATION AND ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA:

- o Must have completed 12 credit hours of college level courses.
- o Must be enrolled as a full-time student or part-time student (minimum of six credits per semester) at Burlington County College in an educational program and with career consistent with the provisions of the Purpose section.
- o Must have achieved a cumulative grade point average (G.P.A.) of 3.0 in all college courses previously taken at any institution (must provide official transcripts demonstrating such G.P.A. in order to receive initial scholarship award).
- o Must provide at least two positive letters of recommendation from high school teachers and/or counselors who actually taught or counseled the applicant. Letters from employers and/or officers of community organizations in which the applicant is serving or served may be submitted in lieu of letters from teachers or counselors. Letters must indicate the applicants involvement in environmental issues and physical fitness endeavors.

METHOD OF SELECTION:

BCC Scholarship Selection Committee, approval of recommended candidate by the Lou W. Maertin Scholarship Committee, and final approval by Mrs. Joan Maertin. At their

discretion, the members of the Lou W. Maertin Scholarship Committee and/or Mrs. Joan Maertin will attend the portion of each BCC Scholarship Selection Committee Meeting at which all applications for this scholarship are considered.
