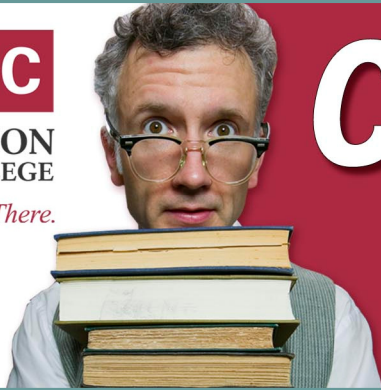

Our alliance with the **Burlington County Library System (BCLS)** in February 2008 has provided us with a multitude of increased benefits to our Library users. Students and BCC staff are now able to get books and media from anywhere in the county within a day or two of their requests, as opposed to the often two week waiting period they had experience having to borrow through Inter-Library Loan within the county. The items can then be dropped off at any participating Library in the county to be returned to BCC. We are getting tremendous feedback from our students and faculty members who avail themselves of the library resources we make available to them.

Another great feature, which we are very excited about, particularly for our ESL students are the classes taking place at the Headquarters, Evesham and Cinnaminson branches of the county Library, teaching Conversational English to students who have studied the basics and want to practice and improve pronunciation. Remembrance in November

The BCC Center for Social Justice, in conjunction with the Office of Veterans' Affairs, is honored to host a joint memorial service to commemorate the 61st anniversary of "Kristallnacht". and pay tribute to our Veterans who so bravely serve us, in the past and present.

"The Night of Broken Glass" is considered by many to be the beginning of the Holocaust in Nazi Germany.

This event will commemorate not only the memory of Holocaust survivors, but also a salute to the Veterans of World War II, many of which helped to liberate the concentration camps. We will feature film excerpts of Kristallnacht events and the subsequent liberation of the camps in Dachau at the end of the war.

We are accepting a book donation for our Center for Social Justice from a WWII veteran, Anthony H. Kuzma, which will be presented by his daughter, adjunct faculty member, Judith Bramble.
